
Here in Sion Mills PS we fully agree with that, especially for primary age children. Here's why:

- * They can interact with their peers by playing, by learning from their classmates by listening to and watching what others are doing;
- * They need to learn how to socialise and they have plenty of practise with the ups and downs of that in school;
- * They share jokes and stories with their peers and the adults in their room (now called their class bubble!!);
- * They have a structure to their day; need to get to bed at a sensible time because they have to be up and in school for 9am;
- * They have The Daily Mile and other activities including their morning and mid-day outside time, where they run and climb and skip and generally just enjoy themselves.

What is Advent?

Advent is a season observed in many Christian churches as a time of waiting and preparation for the celebration of the Nativity of Jesus at Christmas. Advent begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas day and ends on Christmas Eve.



Advent means 'coming' in Latin and is seen as the coming of Jesus into the world. Christians use the four Sundays and weeks of Advent to prepare and remember the real meaning of Christmas.

Some people use Advent as a time of fasting, study, meditation and prayer. Generally, Advent is a time when many people are very busy in preparation for Christmas Day, cleaning and decorating, buying food and gifts, writing cards and letters, and cooking the Christmas feast.
