## **Summer Scheme**

# **Keeping COVID-19 out of school**

Symptoms include: raised temperature, persistent cough, loss of taste and loss of smell.

If anyone in your household has tested positive for Covid-19 your child **should not** attend school and take a PCR test on Day 2 after contact. If their test is negative they may return to school. PHA request that the PCR test is repeated on Day 8. At any point if symptoms arise the child should stay at home and parent/carer notifies the school.

Your household should isolate in accordance with the *latest* Public Health advice.

If your child should begin to display symptoms during the school day they will be placed in supervised isolation until they can be collected by a parent/guardian.

If there is a confirmed case of someone in the school having the Covid-19 virus the school will adhere to the Department of Health's 'Test, Trace and Protect' strategy. This requires the early identification of such cases, rapid testing, tracing of close contacts and isolation to break transmission chains.

### **Morning Arrival at School**

As advised in the Return to School letter on the website, children should enter through Gate 1 (P1, P2C, P2H and P3C) Gate 2 Nursery and Gate 3 (P4L, P5K, P6/7C and P6/7McG). Gates will be supervised from 8.45am until 9.05am. Staff will walk around the perimeter of the upper section of the school to ensure all P4 - P7 children have got into their classrooms safely. If supervisors have left their posts parents/carers should escort their child/ren to the main door to ensure they have entered the school safely.
